



Job Description:

Academic Coordinator, Middle and High School Program

Function: To plan and oversee academic support for LC Remix (middle and high school) program and develop programming responsive to individual student needs. YLFR's community-based Learning Centers focus on helping children develop academically, emotionally and spiritually through after-school and summer programs and long-term relational investment. Directly responsible to: Program Director and/or Operations Director

Immediate subordinates: Program staff, mentors, summer interns

Requirements: Personal confession of faith in Jesus Christ required. The candidate must be a self-starter who enjoys and works well with others from a diverse background. Good communication and organizational skills are also required. Bachelor's degree or higher in education preferred.

Work experience: Student teaching experiences or some experience leading youth in educational as well as spiritual capacities.

Summary: Candidate should demonstrate a kingdom-minded, innovative and creative approach to instruction. Also should be culturally aware and sensitive to the African-American community and other minorities, and able to understand the plight of urban children and families.

Responsibilities include:

- Plan academic assessments, lesson plans, and academic activities for middle and high school students
- Continue development of academic resources and actively cultivate relationships with schools, teachers, and community partnerships
- Work with Program Coordinator and Program Staff to plan and implement after-school and summer programs
- Supervise and invest relationally in middle or high school students
- Lead students in Bible instruction
- Participate in fund development and special events for the organization

- Part-time position, approx. 30 hours/week; if availability differs please inquire
- Typical hours are 12:30-6:30pm (with some flexibility and variation)
